CRIMINAL CONVICTION TIME REPORTING CHART

AR	Convictions: Felonies can be reported back 10 years ; Misdemeanors back 5 years .
CA	Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the disposition date. Non-Convictions cannot be reported at all regardless of age, except for pending charges.
CO	Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the disposition date. Non-Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the arrest date. *Salary Exemption – If the salary is expected to be \$75,000 or more, the 7-year exemptions do not apply.
DC	Convictions can only be reported back 10 years , based on request date.
HI	Convictions Felonies can only be reported back 7 years ; Misdemeanors can only be reported back 5 years Non-Convictions cannot be reported
KS, MD, NH, WA	Convictions & Non-Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the arrest date. *Salary Exemption – If the salary is expected to be \$20,000 or more, the 7-year exemptions do not apply.
KY	Non-Convictions cannot be reported, regardless of age.
NM	Convictions can only be reported back 7 years from the date of release or parole. Non-Convictions cannot be reported except pending trial.
MA	Convictions can only be reported back 7 years from the date of disposition, release, or parole. Non-Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the arrest date.
MT	Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the disposition date. Non-Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the arrest date.
NY	Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the disposition date. Non-Convictions cannot be reported at all regardless of age, except for pending charges. *Salary Exemption – If the salary is expected to be \$25,000 or more, the 7-year exemptions do not apply.
TX	Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the disposition date. Non-Convictions can only be reported back 7 years , based on the arrest date. *Salary Exemption – If the salary is expected to be \$75,000 or more, the 7-year exemptions do not apply. Convictions can only be reported back to age 18.
